Cody Grewing shared some projects including water quality at Newell Lake and replacement of woven wire for wildlife friendly fencing. GF&P always looking for projects to partner on.

Jason Schlafmann introduced himself, he is new to the position with NWTF and located in the Rapid City office, this position is sponsored by seven different partners. He has a forestry background.

SDSU has purchased acreage near the high school in Sturgis to be used as a soil health research farm, they will be looking for a panel in the near future to determine the structure (ie Dakota Lakes)
